GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE REGION

The Host City – Maniago (Friuli Venezia Giulia – Italy)

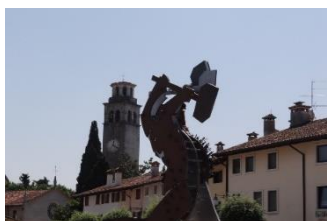


Maniago is famous all over the world for its production of knives and all kinds of cutting tools: the beginning of its history can be dated back to 1453, when Nicolò from Maniago obtained permission from Venice Water Authority to canalize Colvera's stream into an irrigation system.



Along the same irrigation system, various ironworks were established, where, besides farming tools, people also started to produce swords and spears for the Republic of Venice.

Since then, Maniago has given rise to hundreds of blacksmiths and knife makers. To this day, there are about 100 factories that are still working in this trade.



Since 1907, the first large cutlery works took place in a building which is now the Museum of Ironwork art and cutlery works. This museum reconstructs workplaces and displays the main past and present productions of the town's industry.



Maniago, with about 12.000 inhabitants, stands out with its large Piazza Italia, which overlooks the main historic buildings. These include the fifteenth-century Cathedral in late Friulan Gothic style dedicated to St. Mauro the Martyr, the Palazzo D'Attimis Maniago which features the fresco of St. Mark's lion. It was attributed to Pomponio Amalteo and is evidence of the long Venetian rule.



The Host City – Montereale Valcellina (Friuli Venezia Giulia – Italy)



Montereale Valcellina is considered the “gateway to the Valcellina”, a valley that opens into the Friulian Dolomites. The villages stand on an alluvial terrace amidst the green countryside of the foot hills between charming watercourses and cultivated fields, protected by the rim of the pre-Alps to the rear. A visit here alternates between the vibrant colours of the landscapes

and the towns and villages, where the centuries have left behind invaluable historic, artistic and cultural legacies. Montereale differs from the towns on the plain; however its churches, mansions, impressive engineering works and ancient buildings, simple streets and unspoilt natural environments tell a tale of a remote, intriguing past and a dynamic, highly active present day. The calendar of events is filled with recreational, cultural and sports engagements, initiatives and activities promoted and organised by the Municipal Authorities and the numerous associations that seek to bring life to these bustling, undoubtedly interesting places.



The Host Region – Friulian Dolomites Valleys

Unique territories and environments: all to be discovered!



Valcellina Valley. One valley, 5 towns and plenty of extraordinary views, including the Barcis Lake and Cellina's Hole. Within the Friuli Venezia Giulia's region, the lake combined with the canyon are the popular and striking tourist attractions. A unique view can be enjoyed when crossing the old road of the Valcellina valley. This road used to connect Montereale and Barcis. It is no longer accessible by car. On certain days and during certain times, it is accessible by train.



After passing **Andreis, Claut, Cimolais**, you arrive at the **Friulian Dolomites Natural Park**; this park is recognized by UNESCO as one of Italy's World Heritage Sites. Its symbol is the **"Bell tower" of Montanaia's Valley**. It is 300m high and can be observed from different locations within the valley. This area is perfect for hiking and trekking lovers.



After continuing on the road, you arrive at **Erto and Casso**. There, looking just in front of it, you can still see signs of a huge catastrophe that happened in 1963, when a part of the "Toc" Mountain fell inside the artificial lake that was under it. A path takes visitors to the dam and reminds them of what happened on that day.



Colvera's Valley

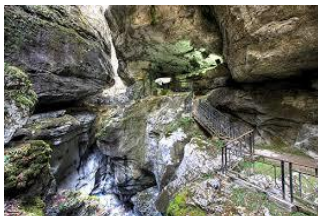
From the Colvera valley you can admire the view of the "Raut" Mountain and Colvera's Creek that runs across it. By walking along the creek, you can observe how the creek formed the rocks throughout the years. It created structures such as the **Landri Scur and Landri Viert** as well as the **Bus del Colvera Village**.

The valley is known for its well-established craft traditions, based mostly in Frisanco and Poffabro. The rural architecture, in this region, is characterized by three-story houses with particular wooden balconies supported by high stone pillars. A visit to the *"Li Mans di Carlin"* is highly recommended. It features miniature versions of the local buildings, created by Carlin Beltrame.



Tramontina Valley

In the past, people lived in many small isolated villages in this natural environment. One such village was submerged by Redona's lake, only to resurface during a dry period.



Cosa Valley e Arzino's Valley

The river formed many gorges and natural pools, which are popular tourist destinations in summer. In Pradis, there are caves which show traces of humans from the Paleolithic period. There is also a museum in this area.



Magredi

The Magredi plain extends along the south of Maniago. This unique environment is located between two big waterways, the Meduna and Cellina river. Once the rivers flow underground, white, round stones decorate the surface. This is a very memorable region, which is known for its delicate yellow flowers (*Brassica glabrescens*), which are exclusively found sprouting between these rocks. Beyond the area's interesting fauna, you can also spot a bird, the Occhione, which has particularly unique eyes. The European Union has recognized the Magredi region as a site which has particular importance on a community level.



Museum of ironwork art and cutlery work - Maniago
600 years of knife manufacturing history can be explored at this museum. The century long tradition is depicted by a myriad of blade types and other work instruments.



Hydroelectric power-plant Museum "A. Pitter" – Malnisio For 80 years, a hydroelectric power plant supplied Venice with energy. It was in use from 1905 to 1988, and brought energy to San Marco's square.



Carnera Hall

The municipality of Sequals contains the house of the boxer Primo Carnera, who became a world champion in 1933. Now, his house has been turned into a museum, where you can get to know how he lived.



The Cave Museum – Pradis di Sotto (Clauzetto)

Since July 2001, visitors can discover the cave and its associated exhibition, which features an overview of how humans and animals lived across the centuries.



Friuli's Mosaics school – Spilimbergo

Different mosaic work, from different centuries, can be found at this school. Over 100 years ago, it was opened in 1922 and exhibits the work of its students to this day.

GUIDED TOURS → FOR INFORMATION AND BOOKING:

At Maniago and Montereale Valcellina, but also nearby in other small towns, there are plenty of **camping places and rest areas** that can accommodate the athletes, their teams and event organisers for the duration of the event.

GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE EVENT

The event is supported by the Cites of Maniago and Montereale Valcellina, the Italian Government of Sport and other Sponsors.

Time trials start and finish line is located at the City Stadium - Via dell'Omo, Montereale Valcellina.
Road races start and finish line is located at the Piazza Italia directly in front of the City hall of Maniago.

The logistics area, the anti-doping center and the local organizing committee are located near the City Hall in Maniago. The anti-doping area for ITT is located Via della Stazione, 71 Montereale Valcellina.

The course passes through the streets of Maniago and Montereale Valcellina, consisting of wide roads and some ascents. They are a fast circuits that will be held on safe roads.

TRANSPORTS

By plane:

The Intercontinental Venice Airport, "Marco Polo" is 91 km away. Maniago is reachable in 1 hour via the Highway A28.

Trieste Airport is located in Ronchi dei Legionari. Maniago is 110 km (1h20m) away and can be reached via the A4 and A28 highway.

Another airport "A. CANOVA" is located in Treviso. Maniago is 90 km (1 hour) away and can be reached via the A27 highway.

In Verona, there is another international airport "Catullo". After 218 km, using Highways A4 and A28, you can arrive at Maniago in 2h20m.

Public transport:

You can also take the train from Pordenone to get to Maniago.

Car:

You can also drive to Maniago via the A28 Highway by taking the exit Pordenone.

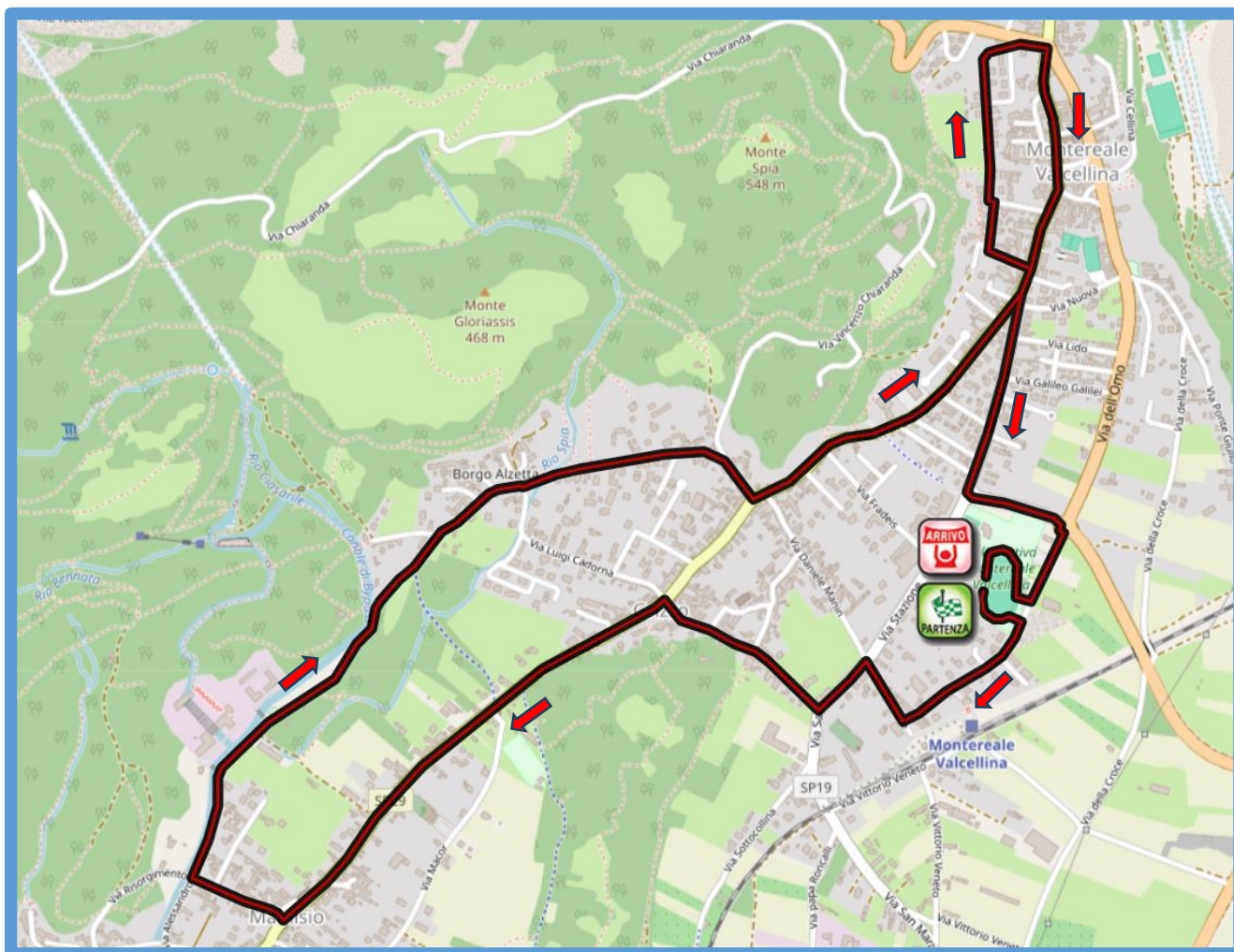

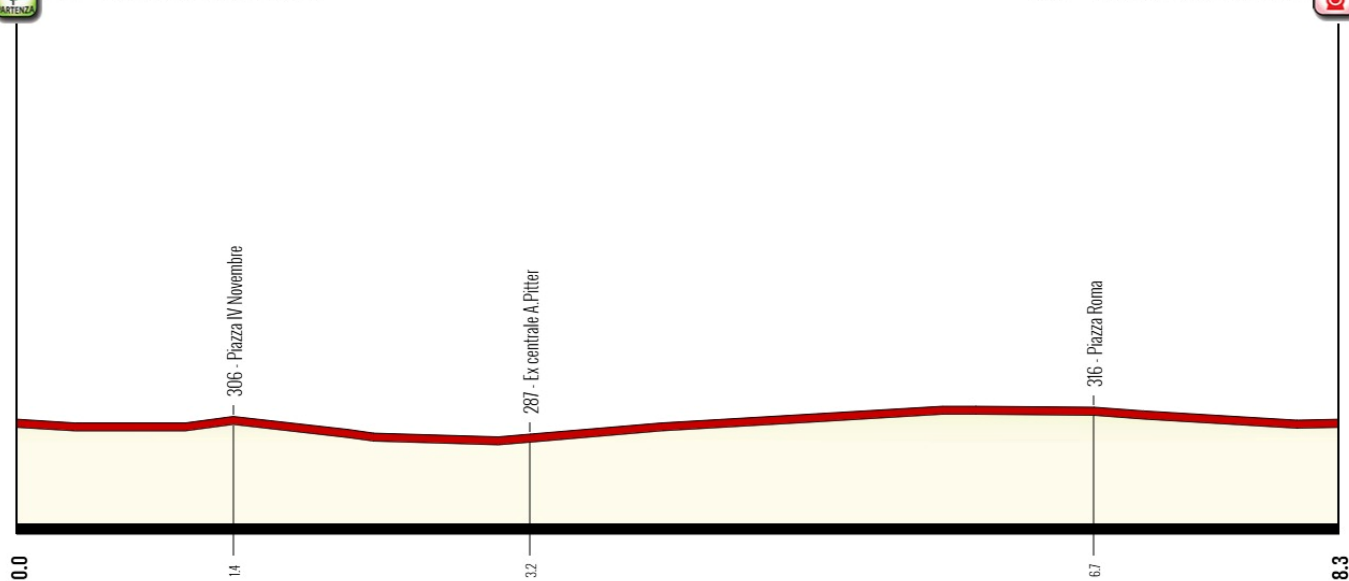
Time Trial – Montereale Valcellina - 8.3 Km/lap



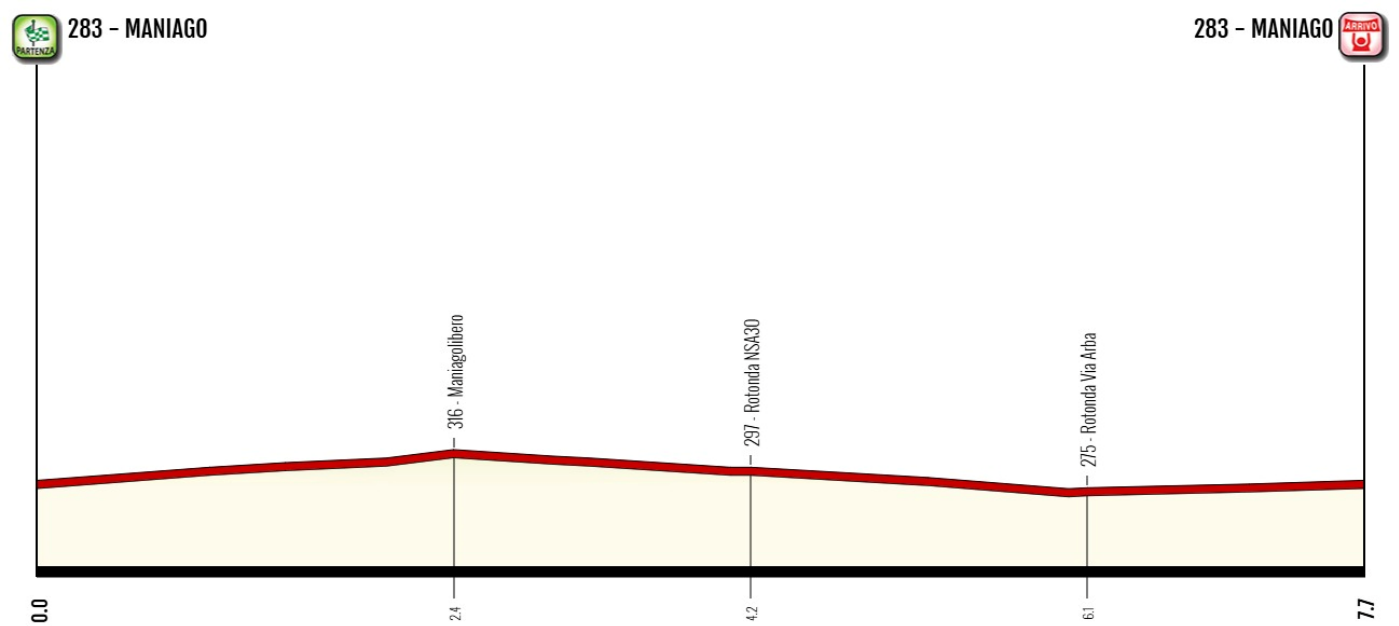

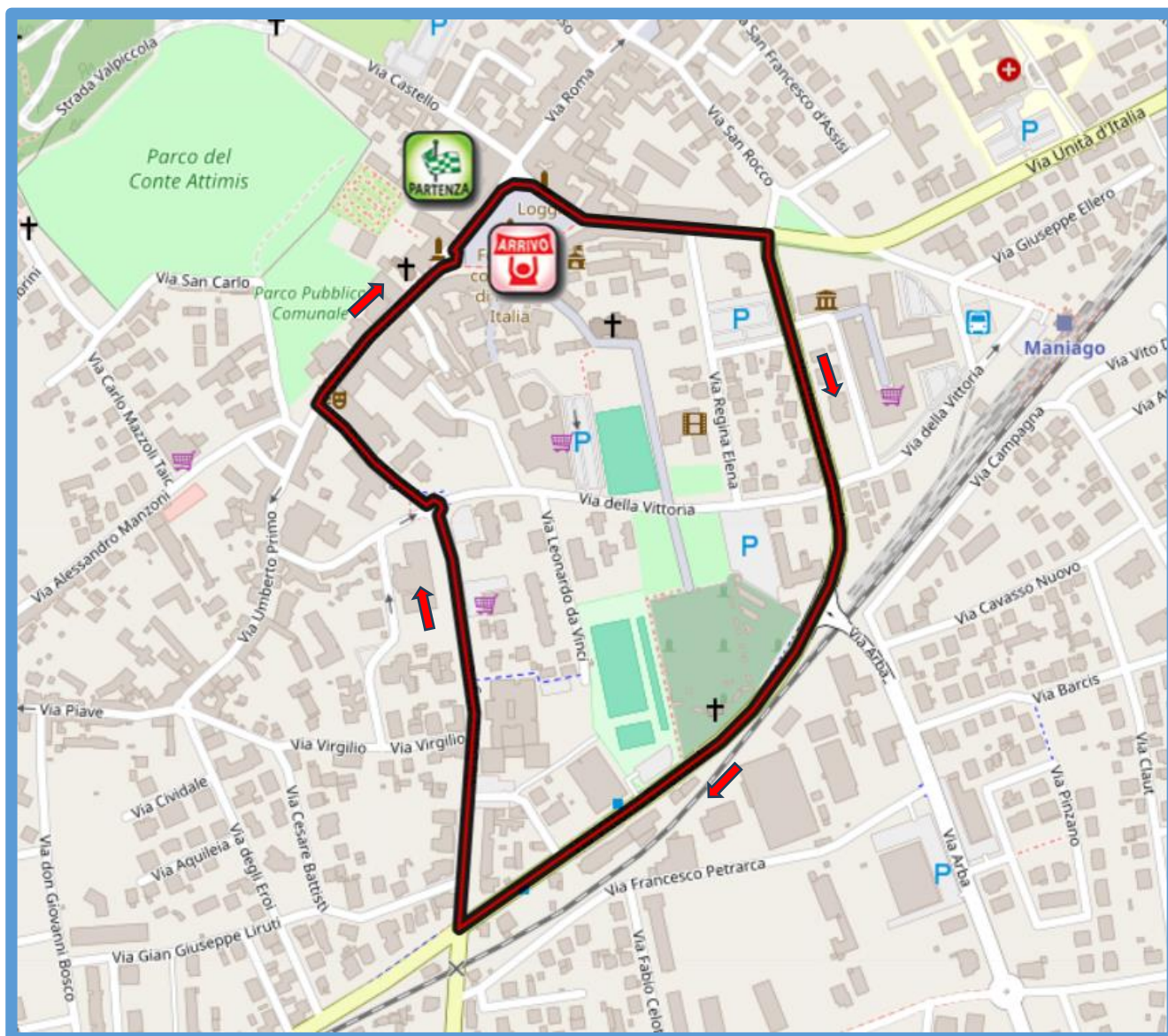
Start / Finish Line - Piazza Italia, Maniago

RIDERS' REGISTRATIONS

National Federations shall confirm their participation on the UCI online registration system no later than 9th April 2025 at 12:00 CET. In reference to the UCI regulations (art. 16.20.006), registration shall take place on the UCI online registration website <http://regonline.UCI.ch>.

The registration must include the number of persons making up each delegation, registration of riders in each race as well as their sport class, accommodation used during the event, full contact details of the team manager and each athlete's time of arrival.

A single representative from each National Federation shall confirm the starters of each nation, as well as whether they are participating through the national team, as individuals or for any other team under the recommendation of the National Federation.

The UCI online registration begins 25 March 2025 at 12:00 (CET) and closes on 09 April 2025 at 12:00 (CET). The registration fee will be € 75.00 per registration request. Refunds will not be done for athletes who did not complete the online registration. Until payments have been made, registration will not be considered as being completed. Only National Federations that have paid their registration fee within the deadline will receive an accreditation and will be able to take part in the competition.

UCI and Organizing Committee will not be held responsible if you or your team miss their return flight due to delays in the program.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Transponder

The Organising Committee will provide the Team Manager with a Transponder for each athlete competing, with a caution fee of € 50.00 each (only payable using cash for a maximum of € 500). At the end of the competition, the transponder must be returned in exchange for the deposit.

Insurance

Each team is responsible for the insurance of its athletes. It is compulsory that the insurance covers: damage to property, personal injuries and/or health problems, third-party liabilities.

The Organising Committee is not responsible for any losses or damage to the material stored.

MEDIA ACCREDITATIONS

All media planning to attend the event must be accredited in order to gain access to the press room, the press vehicle and the start/finish area. To apply for a press accreditation for the UCI Para-Cycling Road World Championships Maniago you are obliged to fill in the form on the website: <https://paraciclismomaniago.it/> or send your request by e-mail to: press@paraciclismomaniago.it indicating:

Press accreditations will be reviewed by the official press officer and may be refused, if not suitable.

VISAS

Your request must be written on official stationery of the National Federation and should be signed and stamped by the President or the Secretary. The following information must be given for each member of the delegation:

- Arrival and departure dates
- The place of residence during the entire stay
- A declaration confirming that all costs for accommodation, travelling, health and expenses incurred in treating any injury, will be covered by the National Federation
